Anne-Marie Parent, urban planner, landscape architect and civilian and commercial certified mediator.

A member of the Quebec Association of Urban Planners and the Quebec Association of Landscape Architects, Anne-Marie Parent holds a Bachelor of Arts degree and a Bachelor's degree in Landscape Architecture from the Université de Montréal, as well as a Master's degree in Urban Planning. From 1972 to 1977, she held positions in the federal government and in the private sector for a consulting engineering firm. In 1977, she founded the consulting firm Parent Latreille and Associates, consultants in urban planning, landscape architecture and environment, where she held the position of CEO until 2009. Her projects include the design and construction of public and municipal spaces, including many parks and green spaces.

In 2001, Anne-Marie Parent was appointed by the federal government as Chair of the InfraGuide National Committee on Environmental Protocols, a team of experts examining environmental conditions and opportunities for municipal infrastructure and climate change.

During her career, she has been Assistant Professor and Lecturer at the Faculty of Planning at the University of Montreal. Her presence has been noted on the municipal scene as advisor, President of CCU and Acting Mayor of a borough at the City of Montreal where she was a member of the Commission on Transport, Environment and Sustainable Development.

As a full-time member of the Quebec Office of Public Hearings on the Environment (BAPE) from 2009 to 2017, Anne-Marie Parent chaired eight commissions of inquiry, acted as commissioner for three commissions of inquiry and realized three mediations in environment of which two as responsible mediator.
